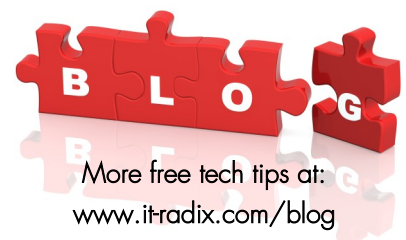

## Why You Need MFA

With cyberattacks on the rise, an increasing number of small-to-medium sized businesses fall prey to phishing attacks and security breaches daily. Companies are under increasing pressure to prevent data loss and avoid breaches that damage both profit and reputation. In the event an email password or network credential is compromised, an attacker is well-poised to breach the company's systems undetected.

Conversely, a good rule of thumb is to compose emails from the bottom up to save both time and embarrassment. Here's the proper way to compose an email:

- 1<sup>st</sup>... Insert any attachments (so you don't forget)
- 2<sup>nd</sup>... Compose the body of the email and proofread
- 3<sup>rd</sup>... Add a subject (summarize the intent of the email)
- 4<sup>th</sup>... Insert the recipient address(es)

- (1) Open the page you want to bookmark.
- (2) Click the star on the right of the URL box. (A pop-up box will appear.)
- (3) Customize the name for the site.
- (4) Leave Folder as "Bookmarks bar" so that it automatically appears on the top of page.
- (5) Click <Done> to save.
